### **Mallanbool Discovery Walk. - Saturday 3rd of July**

As part of the lead in to NAIDOC week ( 4- 11 th July) you are invited to come along to enjoy a reflective and educational walk around Mallanbool Reserve at 11:30 am, Saturday 3 rd of July. Melway's reference is map 68, K8 Leila Road, Carnegie.

Come along and learn about the two peoples who make up the Kulin nation that occupied this area thousands of years ago. Get a glimpse of the local life and culture of the men and women of the clans. Feel the shape and flow of the land, listen to the birds and learn more about their life at the sound posts, whilst experiencing the indigenous vegetation that surrounds you. Connect with some of the stories of the people of both harmony and sadness.

Bring your imagination, sense of adventure, some warm clothes and a light lunch and thermos to enjoy lunch together after the walk, at Packer Park, just opposite this gem of a reserve. There is undercover shelter available, plenty of great playground equipment, picnic tables and plenty of parking on the Packer Park side of Leila Road ( north side).

### **Glen Eira Winter Shelter - 4th July to September 23rd**

Just a reminder that if you wish to be part of this wonderful joint community venture, of providing support for 10 homeless people at seven local churches, that you need to register your interest in being a volunteer by Thursday, 24 June. The program is being run by Compass Community Care (local church community centre in East Bentleigh) and in addition to registering online, volunteers are required to have a current Working with Children Card and to apply for a National Police Check online. Volunteers are needed to help with a variety of roles, including assisting with evening meals in the kitchen, laundry help, transporting guests in a minibus or helping to move the equipment trailer with bedding and personal belongings using their own vehicle.

As well as this people can assist at the Day Centre Program being run from Compass Community Care Centre in East Bentleigh, or assist in an evening program at one of the seven churches. This is a wonderful opportunity to network with other local churches and show love and compassion to people who are homeless during the winter months. Over 150 volunteers are needed to run this program efficiently, so far numbers are around 120, the more help the better. No special skills are needed just some dedicated time and a desire to help engage in whatever way you can.
