WELCOME & INTRODUCTION

Welcome to you all. It is great privilege to gather together to worship God. For those who are using these worship resources at home, I hope they help contribute to your journey with Jesus.

Today we look at the Parable of the Sower and the Weeds. As each petition of the prayer for others is completed worshippers are invited to place some wheat grains (from a bowl on the Communion table) onto a Cross. Those at home might like to do something similar at home (perhaps using grains of rice if you don't have any wheat.) Today we will also refresh ourselves on what parables set out to do, read about Jacob, one of the not so heroic followers of God and unpack another deep section of Romans – but we are examining each of these stories using the tool of PARABLE. Prepare to be surprised.

CONFESSION

Lord

Sometimes I get to thinking that I am in control. Then I am reminded that you have known me and held me always.

In compassion and love you forgive me for my arrogance and my sense that I belong to myself.

Sometimes I forget that I have an obligation to live life with others in mind. I get to thinking that I can hide from your Spirit. I am your child but figure I can be more than I am.

And then, in compassion and love you forgive me for settling for less than I am.

I forget that I need to seek freedom, for myself, for my neighbours and for your creation. Instead I suffer under inaction and lack of empathy.

In compassion and love you forgive me for my lack of insight and thinking everything is here for my pleasure and convenience.

Sometimes I take on the idea that I have the right to judge the actions and motivations of others, forgetting how much you have forgiven me.

In compassion and love you forgive me and offer me healing and freedom. You offer me life, and ever more life. You remind me that together we are all your beloved children.

ASSURANCE OF PARDON

Hear then Christ's word of grace to us: "Our sins are forgiven". Thanks be to God.

A REFRESHER ON PARABLES.

Parables are usually but not always stories; usually made-up stories, but a particular kind of story.

First, a parable is set within the context of the listeners world. Hence Jesus told a lot of parables that employed the theme of the rural because Palestine was very rural.

Second, a parable is about 'truth' - not necessarily historical truth – it points the listener in the direction of an important reality: an important truth.

 3^{rd} A Parable makes **A** POINT – a single point - an important point; dramatically.

4th Parables encourage the listener to develop deeper perceptions about a difficult concept, issue, value, or truth. There is always an element of mystery in a parable, even apparent confusion.

Finally, parables use hyperbole: i.e. exaggeration to emphasize THE point of the parable.

THE SERVICE OF THE WORD

Your Word, O Lord, is a lamp to our feet A light to our path.

GENESIS 28:10-19a

Jacob left Beer-sheba and went toward Haran. ¹¹He came to a certain place and stayed there for the night, because the sun had set. Taking one of the stones of the place, he put it under his head and lay down in that place. ¹²And he dreamed that there was a ladder set up on the earth, the top of it reaching to heaven; and the angels of God were ascending and descending on it. ¹³And the **LORD** stood beside him and said, "I am the **LORD**, the God of Abraham your father and the God of Isaac; the land on which you lie I will give to you and to your offspring; ¹⁴and your offspring shall be like the dust of the earth, and you shall spread abroad to the west and to the east and to the north and to the south; and all the families of the earth shall be blessed in you and in your offspring. ¹⁵Know that I am with you and will keep you wherever you go, and will bring you back to this land; for I will not leave you until I have done what I have promised you."

¹⁶Then Jacob woke from his sleep and said, "Surely the LORD is in this place—and I did not know it!" ¹⁷And he was afraid, and said, "How awesome is this place! This is none other than the house of God, and this is the gate of heaven." ¹⁸So Jacob rose early in the morning, and he took the stone that he had put under his head and set it up for a pillar and poured oil on the top of it. ¹⁹AHe called that place Bethel;

REFLECTION ON THE KINGDOM VIA PARABLE 1.

REFLECTION: 1.) The Parable of Snakes and Ladders (with apologies to the writer of the Book of Genesis.) Once there was a man who was a ratbag. Born into a loving family, he nevertheless, took advantage of his privileged position in the family.

He was very cultured and smart, but full of himself AND sneaky. He secretly stole things and carefully manipulated people to his advantage.

His mum thought the sun, moon and stars shone out of his you-know-where! however, he manipulated members of his family, including his mum and his brother – nor did he hit it off with his dad!

In fact, he stole his inheritance from his older brother: A real snake in the grass! Then, as they grew older, he started to worry about his brother. 'Perhaps he will come after me and kill me!' So, rather than calling in a mediator to solve the family dysfunction – created by himself – he 'shot through!' He ran like a coward when he thought his brother might turn on him.

As the years passed, off in a far country, he was reasonably successful; accumulating wealth and family (a couple of wives etc)......but there was something missing – something wasn't quite right. Home was calling....but.... was it safe....?

After much prevaricating, backing and forth-ing, he decided to head for home. He and his family along with all his entourage.

But being a scaredy cat, the coward that he was, as he got closer and closer to home, he got more and more nervous. At this point the ratbag in him really came out. When he was still a fairly safe distance from home, he struck upon a nasty plan! I am afraid to say: another snake-in-the-grass effort.

He determined to send his whole caravan on ahead, to, as it were, test the waters with his brother, in his absence (of course!)! He didn't go, that would have been far too dangerous - OMG - another 'snake-in-the-grass' effort! Send the family off as the sacrificial lambs!

So, there he was, all alone, worried, scared stiff, nervous BUT eventually falling into a deep sleep and having one very scary dream. Particularly scary for a sleazy snake of a man, because the dream was about a ladder that goes right to the top of the 'playing board': HEAVEN! AND snakes are notoriously bad at climbing ladders.

Then SHE came down

WOW! – yes, SHE came DOWN the ladder – down to the bottom of the playing board! I reckon Sleazy might have even been 'sweating in his sleep' – dreaming: 'AHHHH, SHE is coming to get me!!!

THEN a dream of a miracle or was it a miracle of a dream happened – SHE actually AFFIRMED the Sleaze Bag!!!! [An aside: I think, rather than affirming him, SHE should have given Sleazy a swift kick up the you-know-where!]

SHE said: 'I promised your forbears I would 'make them great again!' MY sort of great! You can't 'trump' that, can you!? And yes, 'Ratbag,' the promise applies to you, too! You belong to me. You are my loved child! So, START LIVING LIKE IT! Get on with being one of my kingdom people and make it happen!'

'SO! It's over to you, My Child! I'm off, up the ladder to the top of the board! I'll see you there later!'

Then he woke up and he knew something BIG had happened – so of course, he constructed a statue to SHE......who must be obeyed. But now, he WANTED to obey HER! This was BIG, but more importantly, even though living out HER vision felt really tough, it felt right and for the first time in his life, he really felt good about himself – even felt loved! Suddenly he understood Her words in the dream: "Know that I am with you and will keep you wherever you go"

¹⁷and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ—if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him. ¹⁸I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us. ¹⁹For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God; ²⁰for the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope ²¹that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to decay and will obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. ²²We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labor pains until now; ²³and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. ²⁴For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? ²⁵But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.

REFLECTION ON THE KINGDOM VIA PARABLE 2.

REFLECTION: 2.) The Parable of Paul: The Adopted Son

The family were travelling home. Really travelling HOME! A long journey from Melbourne to Bairnsdale.

In the back sat three siblings. Sister, brother and their newly adopted brother: PAUL.

The 6 month old, Paul, had just become a member of the family – he had been adopted and his two siblings spent most of the journey staring admiringly at their new family member. Adoring looks! Anticipating looks! Loving looks!

Paul had completed the family and the family were all going home, together.

Paul was not a second-choice appendage – this family wanted him to be part of their family and adoption was his method of 'birth into that family!'

It was about choice! Paul was a chosen one!

He completed a family, making for enhanced love and belonging for all members. And that proved to be the case.

In his late teens Paul developed a severe mental illness which led to a heavily disturbed remainder of life for him (and for his family).

In mid-2016, shortly after being released from a 7 month hospitalization in a psychiatric ward, Paul unexpectedly, tragically and accidently died of a drug overdose.

In his eulogy his siblings related:

'In his life, there were two competing gravitational forces operating on Paul. There was the drawing power of his warm, open and committed family and friends, on the one hand, and on the other, Paul's impulse to drag himself away.'

Then later in the eulogy his brother added:

'Paul [had a] strong impulse to reject the welcoming embrace of family and friends who loved him. At the same time, [he was strongly influenced by] the power of that love to draw him back into community.'

The Parable of Paul explains to us (in the words of St Paul), that.....

[we] have [all] received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, "Abba! Father!" ¹⁶ it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, ¹⁷ and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ—if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him. ¹⁸ I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed *to us*.

Herein lies real hope: Paul and Paul's family were/are ALL adopted by God our eternal Mother; as her children, made brothers and sisters with Christ, inevitably also suffer with Christ and astonishingly, enter Christ's glory.

Living or dying, they have hope beyond imagining.

Let anyone with ears listen and hear!

MATTHEW 13:24-30, 36-43

²⁴He put before them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to someone who sowed good seed in his field; ²⁵but while everybody was asleep, an enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat, and then went away. ²⁶So when the plants came up and bore grain, then the weeds appeared as well. ²⁷And the slaves of the householder came and said to him, 'Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? Where, then, did these weeds come from?' ²⁸He answered, 'An enemy has done this.' The slaves said to him, 'Then do you want us to go and gather them?' ²⁹But he replied, 'No; for in gathering the weeds you would uproot the wheat along with them. ³⁰Let both of them grow together until the harvest; and at harvest time I will tell the reapers, Collect the weeds first and bind them in bundles to be burned, but gather the wheat into my barn."'

³⁶Then he left the crowds and went into the house. And his disciples approached him, saying, "Explain to us the parable of the weeds of the field." ³⁷He answered, "The one who sows the good seed is the Son of Man; ³⁸the

field is the world, and the good seed are the children of the kingdom; the weeds are the children of the evil one, ³⁹and the enemy who sowed them is the devil; the harvest is the end of the age, and the reapers are angels. ⁴⁰Just as the weeds are collected and burned up with fire, so will it be at the end of the age. ⁴¹The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will collect out of his kingdom all causes of sin and all evildoers, ⁴²and they will throw them into the furnace of fire, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. ⁴³Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Let anyone with ears listen!

REFLECTION:

3.) The Parable of Grow and Clog (with apologies to St. Matthew)

GROW: 'Hey Clog, what ARE you doing pushing in and choking everything!? Stop it – you don't

belong here! The Grow Wheat family does! You're just a useless Weed! What a worthless

lot you are!! What a parasitic family – just totally......'

CLOG: '....GO the Weeds! Go the Weeds! Go the Weeds. Now, you're talking, Grow! Fact is, us

Weeds are on a real 'high' baby!'

GROW: 'Don't you 'Baby' me! You weed! You lazy freeloaders have no respect for the Grow

family. WE PRODUCE! We don't just suck the goodness out of the ground for our own

benefit - we produce grain! And everybody knows grain is great.'

'So there: Grain is great! Grain is great! Grain is great!'

CLOG: 'Cut it out! So, what!? Your master's gunna dig us out, I don't think so!!! So, how does that

grab ya, hey?!

GROW: 'If it was up to me, you'd all be GONE!'

CLOG: 'But It's not up to you! There's a higher authority! You are just gunna have to learn to live

alongside us 'stinkers!' Ha, ha, ha, ha!!!'

'AND, at any rate, who gets to say you are the goodies, and we are the baddies!? Who? WHO?!! Also, aren't you Do-gooder GGs(Grow Grains), supposed to be caring and forgiving and building up, instead of being so 'full of yourselves!? Us weeds are not very religious, but I heard someone singing in the field the other day – it went somethin' like this:

The reign of God, like farmer's field, bears weeds along with wheat; the good and bad are intertwined 'til harvest is complete.

So, us Weeds who clog things up, is hangin' around Ms Grow, so deal with it!'
