GATHERING TIME

Set aside a time for this practice; prepare yourself, as you might for a usual Sunday morning and remember that there are others from the congregation gathering at the same time as you. There are also many from the church around the globe who are gathering to seek the presence of God as we are. We join with them all.

Prepare a space in the house; find a comfortable chair, light a candle, turn off distracting noises and close the door if that will help you to be still. This is something that does not need to be hurried.

Focusing ... As we pause to contemplate this season of Easter, we consider the precious images in the journey of the baby of Bethlehem to the empty tomb of the resurrected Christ. Consider the generous grace and mercy given for the whole creation, the richness of life unearned and undeserved.. In the quietness and stillness of this time, be grateful to the loving parent, who faithfully travels with us through the storms of our lives, especially when we feel alone, confused and despair.

Acknowledgement of Country: We come to meet this morning from all manner of places, and on the Country of diverse Clans and Nations of First Peoples', and pay our respects to their Elders, past, present, and emerging, and commit ourselves afresh to the journey of justice and reconciliation.

Here we begin another week, weaving together the fabric of our lives, in all their different textures and colours, their changing forms and flows.

Here we mark the things that have gone before and look forward in hope for newness to

Here we celebrate each other's place as one thread in the weaving and cherish the moments when the fabric of our lives become whole.

Readings from the Bible - Acts 4.5-12

⁵ The next day their rulers, elders, and scribes assembled in Jerusalem, ⁶ with Annas the high priest, Caiaphas, John, and Alexander, and all who were of the high-priestly family. ⁷ When they had made the prisoners stand in their midst, they inquired, "By what power or by what name did you do this?" ⁸ Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers of the people and elders, ⁹ if we are being questioned today because of a good deed done to someone who was sick and are being asked how this man has been healed, ^{[C]10} let it be known to all of you, and to all the people of Israel, that this man is standing before you in good health by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, ^[d] whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead. "This Jesus is 'the stone that was rejected by you, the builders; it has become the cornerstone[]]

¹² "There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among mortals by which we must be saved."

Good News named John 10.11-18 "" I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. ¹² The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away, and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. ¹³ The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. ¹⁴ I am the good shepherd. I know my own, and my own know me, ¹⁵ just as the Father knows me, and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. ¹⁶ I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. ¹⁷ For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. ¹⁸ No one takes^[a] it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father."

The Basis of Union of this Uniting Church confesses:

"The Uniting Church affirms that EVERY MEMBER is engaged to confess the faith of Christ crucified and to be his faithful servant. She acknowledges with thanksgiving that the one Spirit has endowed the members of his Church with a diversity of gifts, and that there is no gift without its corresponding service." (Para 13)

In this <u>chapter of John's good news</u>, Jesus makes these "I AM shepherd!" "I AM DOOR!" claims right before he faces the death (not dying or resuscitation but dead and buried and rotting) of his friend Lazarus. Jesus' response to that death will lead directly to his own arrest, trial, torture and death - real death - and God's act of affirmation through raising Jesus from death.

The promise which is made - here and in that chapter 10 story - is not that dying corpses will be resuscitated, be they people or our cherished models of church or community life. The promise is that there is no separation from God and the working of God in life - personal or corporate, yours or mine. There is a story worth telling - one that we cannot stop from speaking.

"I am the Good shepherd; the good shepherd gives his life for his sheep!"

And ... "I have other sheep who are not of this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice."

- This promise is true for groups, it is true for individuals, it is true for you and me.
- It is true when we feel cared for by those we think ought to care for us; it is true when we feel abandoned by them.
- The promise is true when we feel life coursing through our involvement in faithful discipleship and it is true when we face its and our imminent dying, death or slow and painful demise.
- It remains true whether we can see and understand it or not; true whether there are "signs" to prove it or not.

The promise stands NOT because Jesus made it, but because GOD KEEPS IT.

"What my father has given me is greater than all else, and no one can snatch it out of the Father's hand. The Father and I are one." (Jo 10:29-30)

All of this sounds (and often feels) like being locked up in our own feelings, needs, hopes, longings, dreams and frustrated possibilities; and we long for someone to set us free.

"I am the Good shepherd; the good shepherd gives his life for his sheep!"

And ... "I have other sheep who are not of this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice."

Therefore, **We** have a story to tell, one which **demands** (?) **NO** one which means we cannot keep silent! AMEN and AMEN
